



























SAQA GLOBAL EXHIBITIONS

- 4-6 different global calls for entry each year
- Posted ~1 year in advance. Submission period is for
 1 month only. Deadline is end of month.
- Some have themes, some do not READ the call details carefully. Don't assume your piece won't fit.
- For a single entry fee, you can enter up to 3 pieces (only 1 piece per artist will be accepted).
- Any SAQA member can enter no matter their location or membership level
- Most exhibitions travel for 3 years review important dates for details

Bearing Witness (SAQA Global) - Call for Entry

Oct 01, 2023 - Oct 31, 2023

Call for Entry Deadline: Oct 31, 2023

Our shared human history includes a violent and shameful component -that of deliberate attempts to eradicate specific populations due to differences of culture, religion, ethnicity, sexual orientation, gender expression and race.



- Artwork must fit SAQA's definition of an art quilt
 "a creative visual work that is layered and stitched
 or that references this form of stitched layered
 structure."
- Pieces can be up to 8 ft in any direction (including 3D work). Needs to fit through a standard door.
- Free standing 3D and ceiling hung pieces are acceptable for most exhibitions (read the call details)
- There is NO year requirement
- Must be of original design



VIRTUAL GALLERIES

- 4 different calls each year
- Selected from volunteer curator submissions
- NO ENTRY FEE! Open to all SAQA members
- No size or date restrictions
- Since it's all virtual, you don't need to ship the piece (or even have it in your possession)
- Galleries stay on website "forever" and include a virtual walk-through tour



TIP: Use the SEARCH function

GET PREPARED

READ THE GUIDELINES AND FAQs!

- Review the call details often (it's rare but dates and venues sometimes do change)
- Know the size restrictions, type of artwork, and important dates EARLY
- Make note of the closing date and time
- Prepare your artist statement ahead of time (paste into submission form)
- Contact calls@saqa.art with any questions.




SAQA Global Call for Entry - StitchPunk

Online entry opens: June 1, 2023

You will receive an error if this limit is exceeded.

- Since there are slight variations in how file sizes are calculated, we recommend a 24 MB targe uploaded images (12 MB each if submitting 2 images or 8 MB each for 3 images).
- The files do not upload until the form is submitted. When a file is selected, you will not see a filename will be displayed (see red circle above).
- If you are accepted into a SAQA Global exhibition, you WILL be contacted if your image isn't sefer to Online



SAQA Exhibition Guidelines

The following information applies to the SAQA Global Calls for Entry, which are open to ALL SAQA members. The policies for Regional exhibitions may vary, ALWAYS refer to the exhibition prospectus for more details.

Please do read the SAQA Exhibition FAQs first as they include a lot of helpful information, including details how to prepare your images and complete the entry form.

Key Exhibition Policies

- · Artist must be a current SAQA member to enter a SAQA exhibition.
- Artwork must fit the SAQA definition of an art quilt: "...a creative visual work that is layered and stitched or that references this form of stitched layered structure."
- · Artwork must be of original design and to the best of the artist's knowledge must not violate any copyright laws.
- · Artwork must match the digital images submitted no further changes or stitching can be made after submission. The submitted full image must show ALL edges of the artwork.
- Artwork MUST be available to travel for the duration of the exhibition. Once work is accepted, the artist cannot withdraw the piece for any reason.

GOOD PHOTOS ARE IMPORTANT!

- Jurors make their selections from online images they do NOT see the actual artwork.
- Using a professional photographer is highly recommended but not required.
- You can take good photos with your phone (but view them larger before submitting!)
- Review the <u>digital image requirements</u> carefully
- Not sure what a pixel is? Don't know how to crop photos? Many resources are available online. –
 YouTube, online classes, SAQA Journal, etc.

TIP: Focus on your lighting!

COMMON ERRORS

DO NOT CROP YOUR PHOTO INTO ANY PART OF THE ARTWORK

All edges of the artwork must be visible along with a small amount of contrasting background.

Your background should be neutral and not include distracting elements such as hands, floors, studio, pets, pins, etc.

Don't use images that are out of focus or too small – view them on a monitor vs a phone

Tips for Successful Art Quilt Photography

What Kind of Background Should I Use?

- NEUTRAL SOLID colors work best for photo backgrounds. Colors such as white, black, grey, beige. Don't use a background with patterns on it.
- ALWAYS use a background that is a different color than the edges of your artwork.
- · AVOID backgrounds that have other objects in them.







TIP: Show your finished edges!

AFTER YOU SUBMIT YOUR ENTRY

Periodically check your email (spam and promotions folders) for communications from SAQA

- Request for new photos which may be required for moving to the jurying stage
- Suggestions for better photos to improve your chances
- Other questions about your entry (collaborators, size checks, etc.)
- Notification email once it's juried (usually the Wednesday or two before notification deadline)

Do not sell your piece or enter another exhibition until you know the status

Do not make any changes to your piece once submitted (you can still add sleeves / labels)



CONGRATS! YOU GOT ACCEPTED

Email Bill Reker at exhibitions@saga.art with questions (artwork prep, installation, venues)

- Sign your contract after reading it carefully especially your name, title, and price
- Save or print your shipping instructions they are important!
- Make a note of the shipping deadline especially since it might be months away
- Be ready to provide new images if requested (or send to SAQA for re-take)
- Take advantage of our shipping assistance for print labels and arranging pickup
- Prepare your artwork carefully for shipping use sturdy boxes, wrap in plastic, add artist and exhibition name on outside, apply colorful duct tape



SORRY, NOT THIS TIME

- Don't take it personally there are many reasons why a piece might not be accepted.
- Usually \sim 35-40 pieces are selected for a SAQA Global Exhibition but this can vary
- 100 500 pieces submitted per global call (average = 239). Since only 1 piece per artist is allowed, average acceptance rate is $\sim 30\%$
- Be professional and DO NOT contact the juror or volunteers for feedback
- SAQA jurors are asked to create a cohesive exhibition based upon the theme. They they are not judges who evaluate each piece on its own merit.
- Check out other opportunities to enter your artwork.
